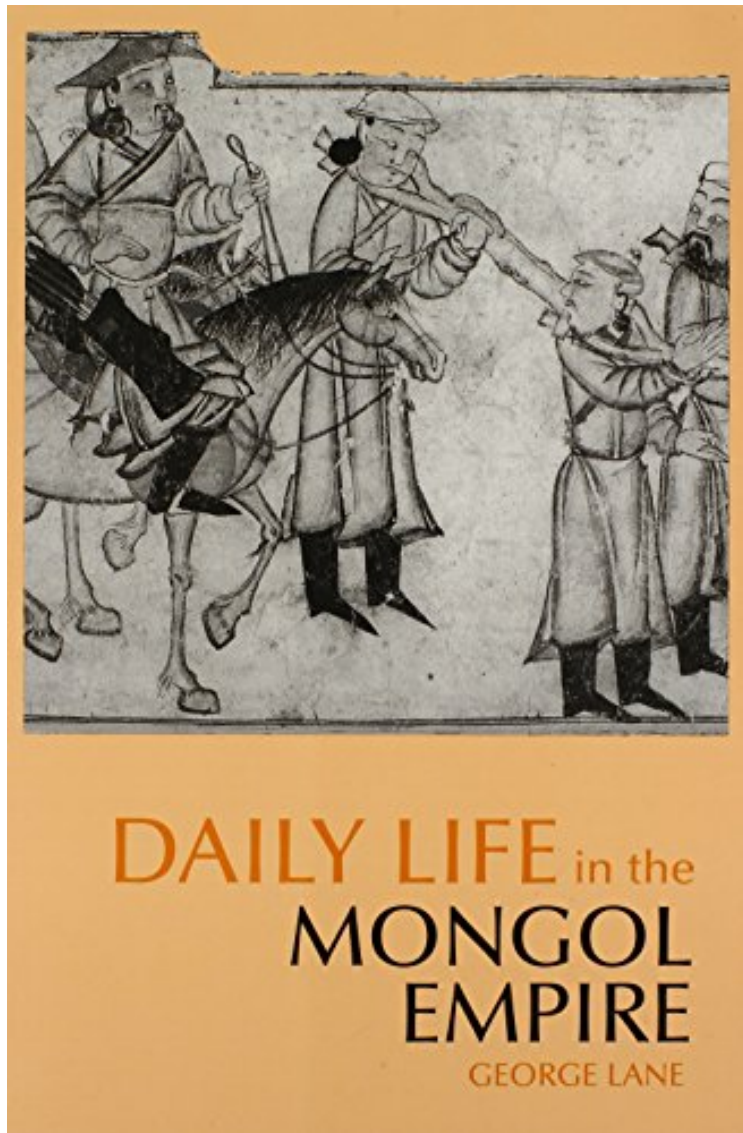

Gets a little bogged down at times, a little repetitious in places. Doesn't go into tremendous details of daily living, but then, these were illiterate people and without much art. The artwork and written descriptive texts that do exist is of the later Mongol period, several generations beyond the stout, grungy steppe nomads we mostly associate with the Mongol culture. But the book is good.
