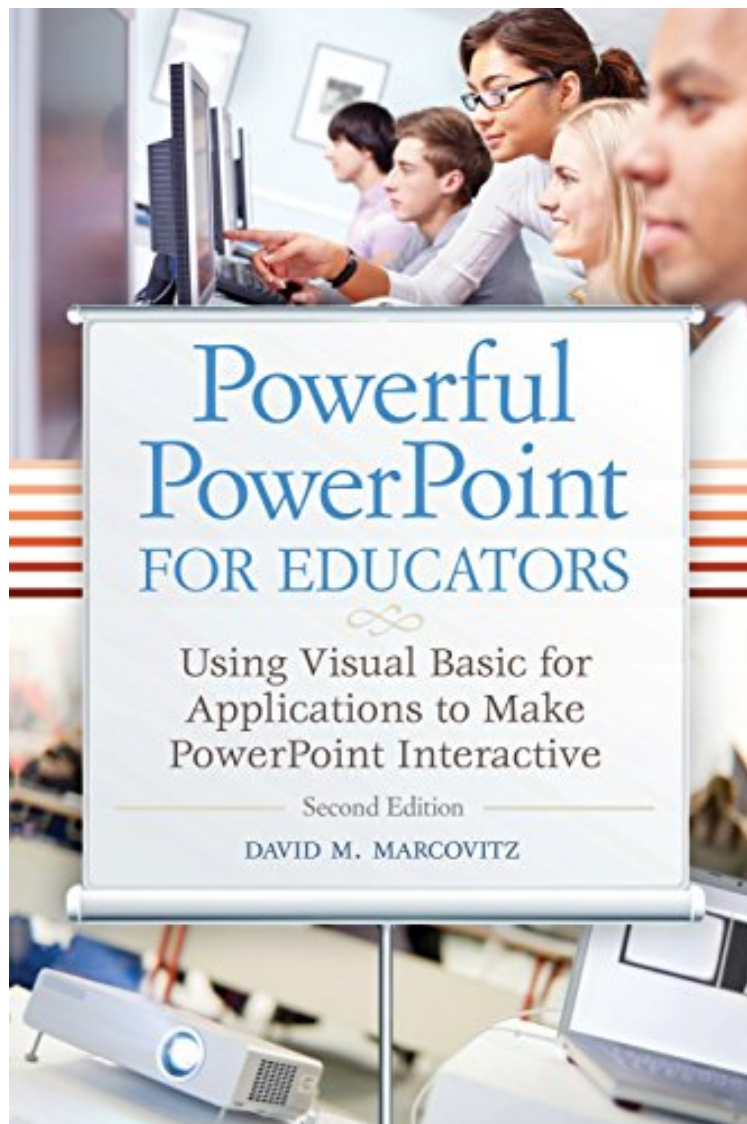

At close to \$50.00, one would expect a comprehensive text on the subject. I went through the book in just over an hour because it contains very little useful information. The basic tasks it sets forward are better served not using VBA. The information which would have been valuable, ie. exposing useful methods and properties are not there. If you are looking for some really good examples of how to use VBA or other technical information on this very complex Microsoft Tool, this is not it. And the author and publisher should be ashamed asking so much for so little.
