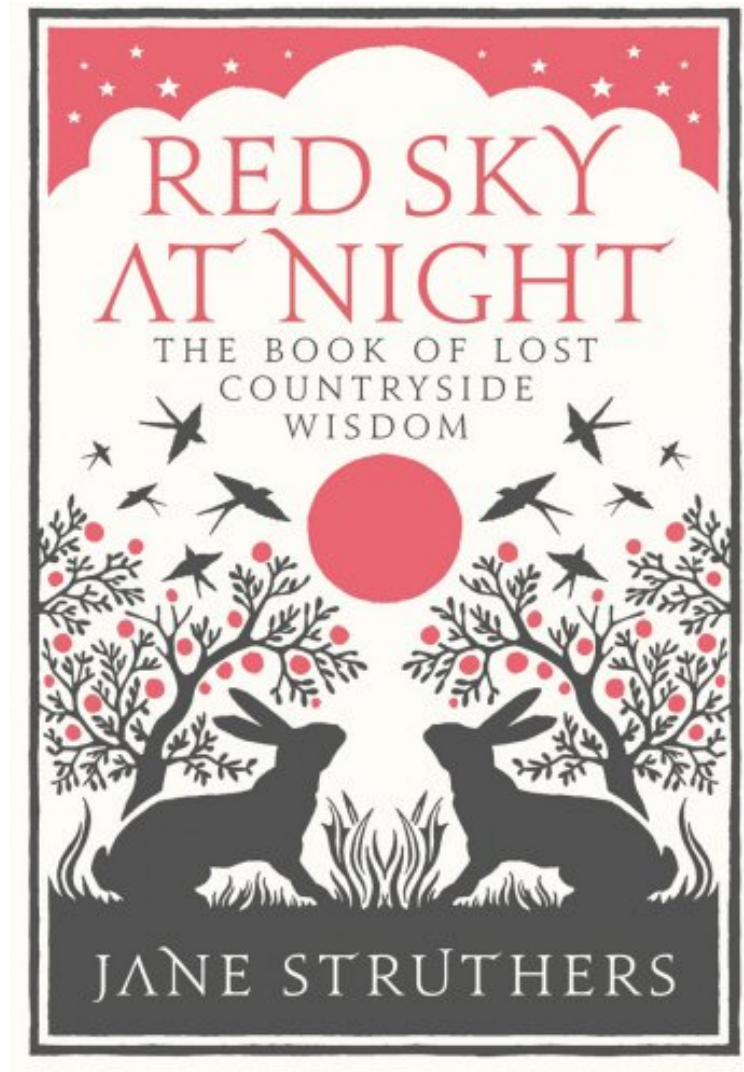

The book touches on a variety of subjects but has no depth of knowledge. It is a book of paragraphs, on this and that at most. You can randomly open the book, read a paragraph and you're done. The most interesting part is the book dust cover art, sadly.I will be returning...The description, and the book I received, are no where near the same thing.Examples:1) "How to navigate by the stars." There is only a brief paragraph describing where to find the North Star, but nothing about navigating once you find them.2) has some

paragraphs describing how to light a fire...but then goes no further (doesn't mention about kinds of wood needed, nor what is needed to make a much larger bonfire).3) not a guide to "everything people knew and loved before we went inside and turned on the TV". It's just some brief discussions about those things, but not a GUIDE to them. A Guide denotes detail. This book does NOT have any detail on any subject, except clouds and some food recipes - those had some detail and attention. In short - the description is about what the book may have aspired to be, but is not about the actual contents. The description wording is misleading and I would highly consider amending the description PROMPTLY...instead, to say it is various conversations about countryside folk lore, tales, and old beliefs.
