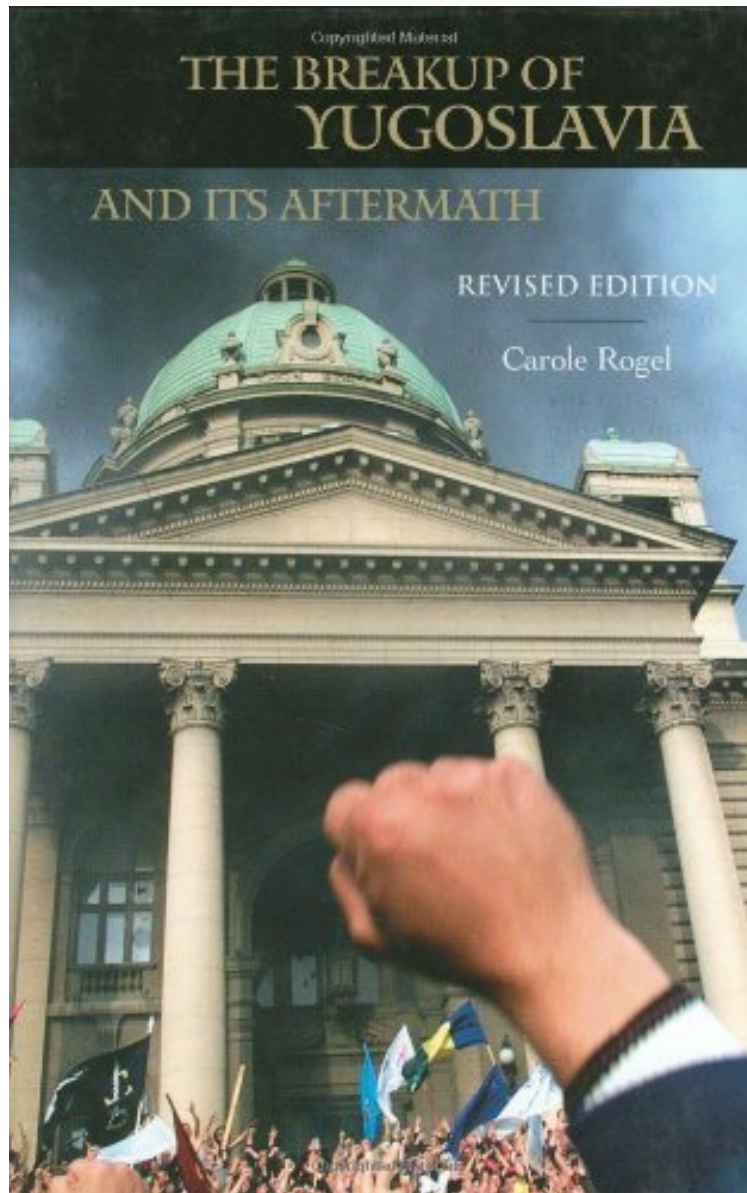

Fascinating to see how a relative success story during the Cold War managed to fragment so thoroughly after its end. There is the usual account of the tortured history of the region, stretching to the Field of Blackbirds where the Slavs were defeated by the Turks. First Slovenia went its own way. With a brief struggle. But then Croatia too. Much bloodier now. Followed by Bosnia and the jockeying between Croatia and Serbia for influence in Bosnia. And so on. The best efforts of the international community seemed somewhat inadequate. Especially after the massacre of 6 000 Muslim males. The book does not end on much of a settled note. It's the endgame now, at least.

Rogel, a leading U.S. specialist on Yugoslavia and the war in Bosnia, examines the breakup of Yugoslavia in 1991, the war in Bosnia, the peace settlement, and the problems that continue to exist in Bosnia and Serbia today. She provides information and analysis to help students understand the collapse of Tito's Yugoslavia, the causes and effects of the ensuing war, and the aftermath of the conflicts. Seven essays analyze the crisis, including two that focus on the aftermath of a decade strained with conflict and war, and the current conditions in the former Yugoslavia.

About the AuthorCAROLE ROGEL is Associate Professor Emeritus of History at Ohio State University. She is coauthor of *Historical Dictionary of Slovenia* (1996) and author of *The Slovenes and Yugoslavism, 1890-1914* (1977), as well as many articles on Slovene cultural and political Yugoslavism. Since her retirement, she has lectured and written extensively on recent developments in the former Yugoslavia.
