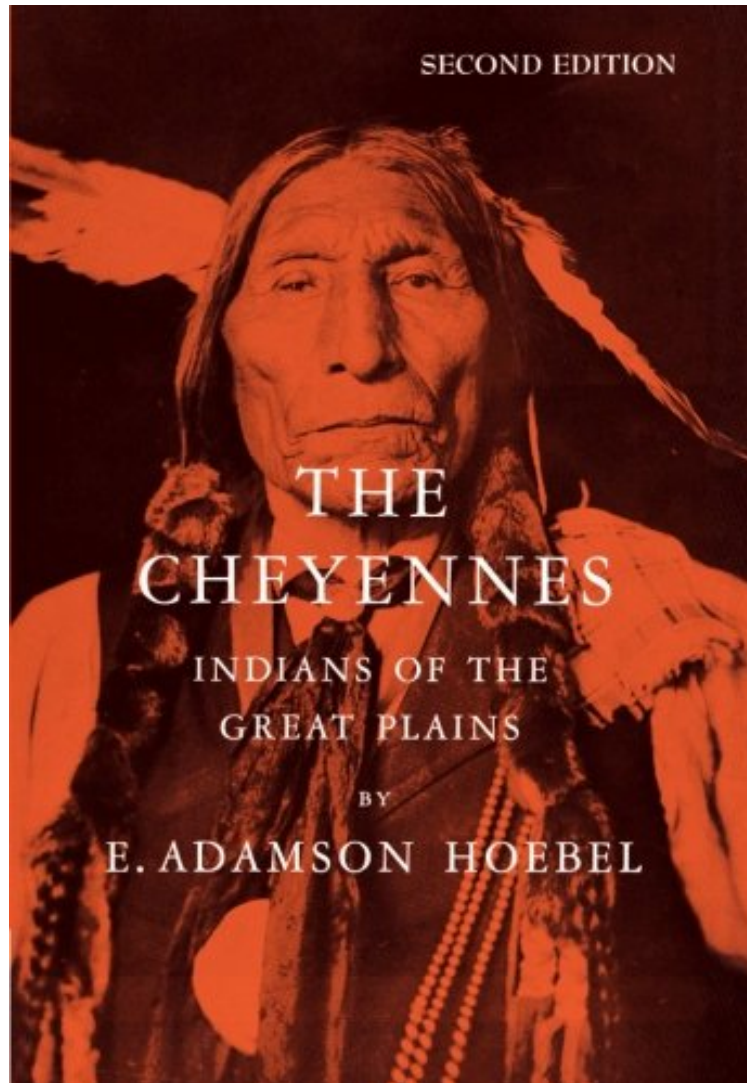

By jorma This second edition study of the Cheyenne (Tsistsistas, meaning "The People") Indians covers their history from the woodlands to the Great Plains to the modern era. (2nd ed. 1978) Okay, so this is a rather old, (1st 1960) anthropological study with a wealth of information, history, and stories about the Cheyennes, not a romantic adventure filled with treason, love deception that keeps you on the edge of your seat. There is good straightforward information about many facets of life of the Cheyennes contained in its 133 pages of text. This is a very good overview, that DOES go into some detail, and if you're interested, will hold your attention. I love the history, but I would say I gravitate to the more spiritual side, this is where a study of this nature lacks. A great volume if your interests are like mine, is "The Wolves of Heaven" by Karl H. Schlesier, that looks at Cheyenne Shamanism ceremony as well as prehistoric origins. (pretty much the subtitle) with great illustrations by Wah-pah-nah-yah. (sorry I don't do that product insertion thing yet) I did enjoy this offering, just have a glass of water nearby, as some areas are drier than others. Recommended.

This case study traces the Cheyenne Indians from their first contact with the French explorer LaSalle in 1680. The book then follows their exodus from Minnesota under pressure from the Sioux, Cel, and Ojibwa; their attempt to gain a foothold in eastern South Dakota and the middle Missouri River; and their final movement into the high western plains in the first half of the 19th century.
