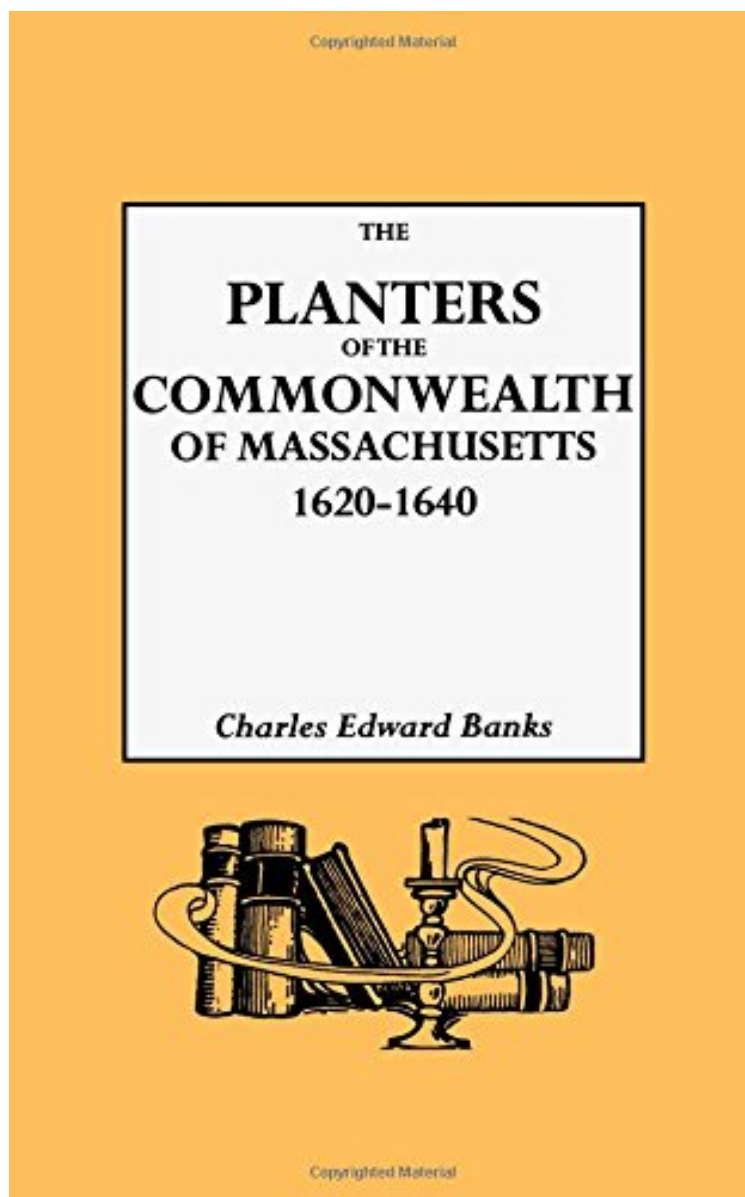

The way the book was laid out made it easy to determine if he had been one of the early founding fathers. Not only did I find him, but was able to find the date he arrived (early 1624), the name of his ship and his wife , children and even that his wife was carrying their 5th child. There was further information outlining education, personal character and relevant personal information about the man in question. I was very pleased. It would have been even better if there had been a little more information available about the children and his wife, details about what happened to him when he left the Plymouth Colony as well as more details as to why he left, but it was great to find out what I did since it happened so long ago..
