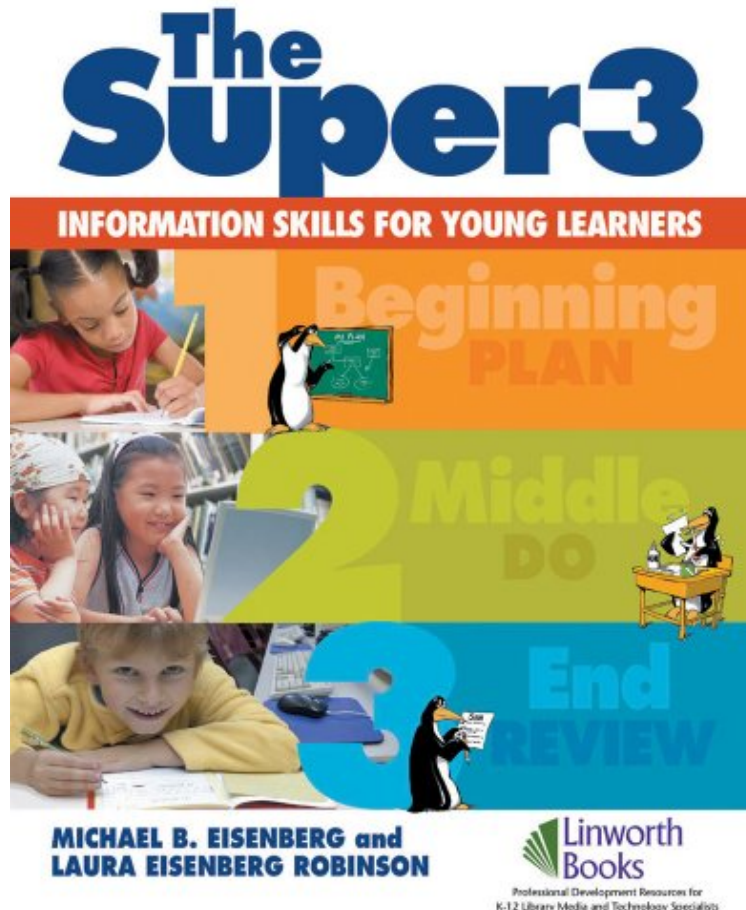

process having written about the Big6 for older students, and presented the information at conferences and workshops. Clearly the steps are the same: plan, do, and review. This framework, though seemingly quite simplistic, is the crux of research no matter the grade level, even graduate students follow these steps. Teachers are given support materials, some not so great song lyrics to help students remember what to do, plenty of ideas. The authors include a chart showing how the Big3 compares with the Big6 which makes it easy to understand terminology. From overview to worksheets and examples, classroom teachers and libraries who teach research skills (don't we all?) will find this a valuable addition to their professional libraries." - Library Media Connection
