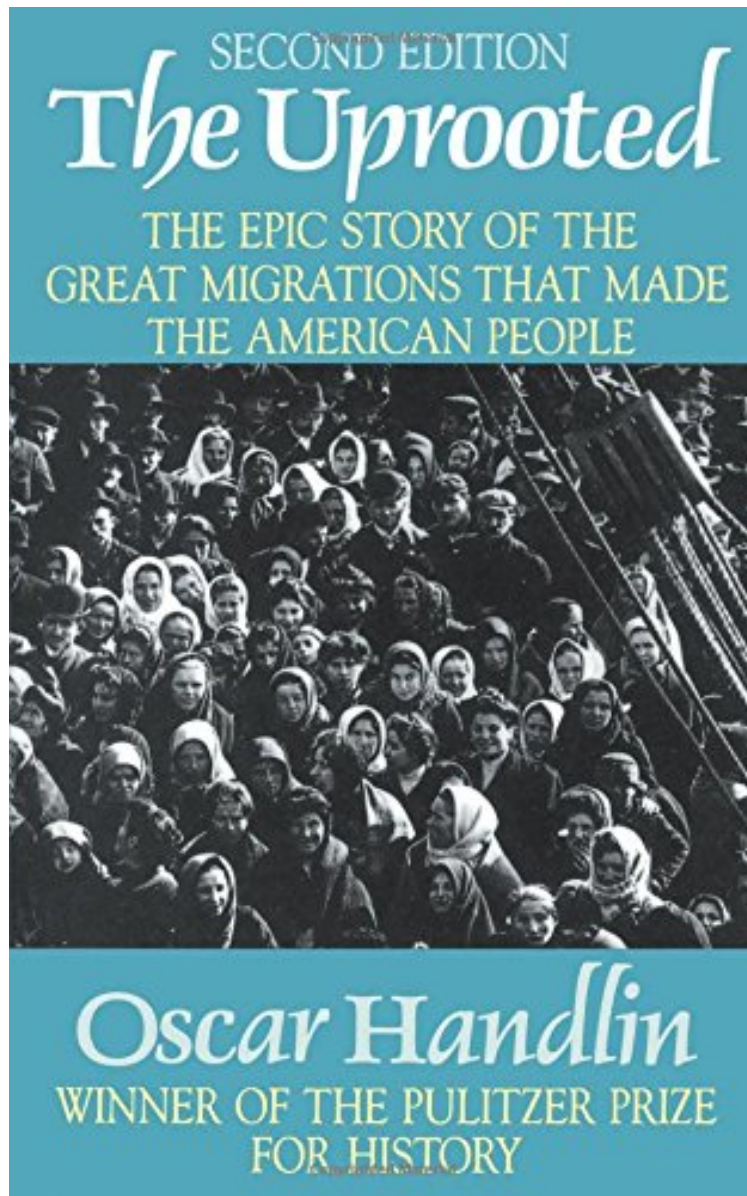

This book does an excellent job in describing how the immigrants must have felt when their lives were radically changed by having to leave their traditional culture and become a part of a culture that was unfamiliar to them and which they did not consider as meaningful in their lives. However, the fact that there is no chronology, that all immigrants are treated the same, and their different experiences are not discussed make it extremely difficult to place them in an historical context. I think this is an imaginative book of sociology or group psychology, but not a work of history.
