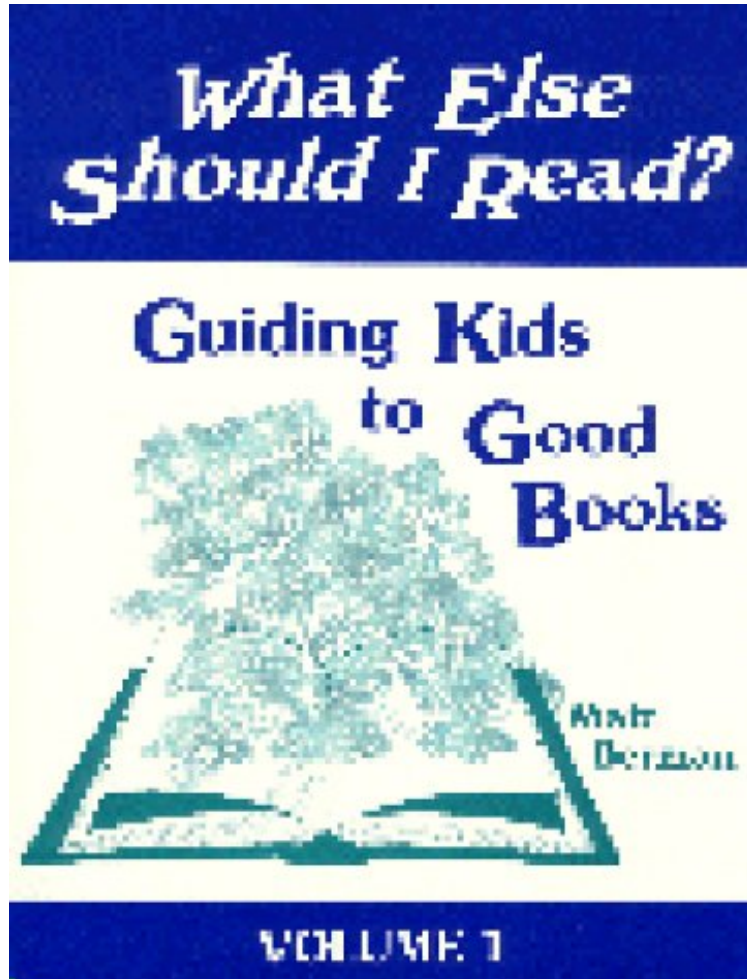

HeissWe are a read-aloud family, and this book is great.Now that the Newbery awards have become so "edgy", I no longer automatically trust that a Newbery book is going to have good themes for my family. I prefer to find books that are deeply interesting and beautifully written to read to my kids. We are all captivated by the story lines, so I want them to be *good, wholesome, loving* story lines. Ideally, I want the books to help shape the character of my little boys. I want excellent male role models, honorable fathers, and brave little boys. And I want the girls to be kind and pleasant.Needless to say, the lady at Barnes and Noble has no idea how to steer me to good books. And sadly, our librarians have little interest in helping us either. So, left to my own devices, I have used this book to lead me to wonderful treasures of literature for my

family. I think this book is written principally for librarians, since it features sample bookwebs that could become bulletin boards, etc. But for a read-aloud family, or a homeschooling family, this book is a valuable resource. For each main book listed (30 in all), it offers topical recommendations to other books, and also blurbs on those books. Wonderful! We have used this book to find wonderful stories that have brought our family a great sense of connectedness. Something like 800 recommendations, with a title index and a topical index. Do your family a favor and dive into this book.

In answer to the perennial question What else should I read? these innovative resources go beyond linear listings of suggestions to help students find books through a variety of directions, including subject, author, and genre. Each guide contains approximately 30 displayable bookwebs that can be used as posters, with reproducible bookmarks that list related titles and fit into pockets on the posters. Each web leads users to 8 to 14 related topics that have lists of relevant books with their authors and brief LC descriptions. Detailed author, title, and subject indexes make further exploration easy. Hundreds of the best fiction books for young readers, titles commonly found in school library collections, are covered in the webs. The visual, nonlinear features of these books make them unique and user-friendly tools for educators and students alike. Perfect for the bulletin board, the bookwebs are a great way to stimulate reading!
